Head lice

We have received reports of some children having headlice this week. Head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families. They are not caused by dirty hair but are picked up by head-to-head contact.

Head lice can make children's head feel itchy. The only way to be sure someone has head lice is by finding live lice. You can do this by combing their hair with a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb). You can buy these online or at pharmacies.

How to get rid of head lice

Treat head lice as soon as you spot them. You can treat head lice without seeing a GP.

Check everyone you live with, or have close contact with, and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day.

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice. You do not need to wash your laundry on a hot wash.



They also have public access computers to use, free of charge, as well as social spaces available to meet other parents.
