This week our Junior Governors are having their first meeting since being elected. We have our open morning for potential new children starting in Reception for September 2026, tomorrow morning. On Friday, we are taking part in the national ROAR project which is explained below.

We have also introduced our scooter park for playtimes and lunchtimes. Thanks to the LMA, we have purchased 20 scooters which come with a helmet, knee and elbow pads. The children have tried them out today and are loving them. It takes a while to get themselves ready to go on them, but we know this will quicken up especially with some older children helping.

ROAR:

This week we are taking part in a national project called ROAR. This is where children are invited to design, make and present an invention that helps people, animals or the planet - life changing ideas. We will be spending Friday on the ROAR project. The children will work in their houses in a group of 4 to 5 children. They will brainstorm ideas of what to make and then choose one. They then design it first and then, using junk modelling, make a prototype. In the afternoon, they put together a 2 minute presentation about their invention. Each group will present to their house and two winners will be picked. We will then have a final assembly all together, where the final eight presentations are shown to the school and we pick an overall winner. The overall winning group then makes a video presentation which is entered into the national awards. A member of the Burgess Hill Lions is coming to spend the day with us and to help us judge the finalists. We therefore need as much junk as possible to help make their prototypes on Friday. This could be boxes of any size, cereal boxes, yoghurt pots, egg boxes, kitchen rolls etc. All must have been cleaned out thoroughly and we are not allowed any junk that has contained nuts. Please bring your junk into the school ready for Friday.


