

## Dear Parents/Carers,

WSCC Safeguarding guidance

What should parents/carers do if they are concerned about an adult in a position of trust?

A parent/carer may be worried that a professional has:

- behaved in a way that has harmed a child, or may have harmed a child, possibly committed a criminal offence against or • related to a child
- behaved towards a child or children in a way that indicates he or she may pose a risk of harm to children
- behaved or may have behaved in a way that indicates they may not be suitable to work with children

In the first instance, parents/carers should contact the setting/organisation to report a safeguarding concern. Parents/carers can also raise concerns directly with governing bodies.

However, if a parent/carer is unsure what to do and needs advice on how to report concerns, they can contact the Local Authority Designated Officer via LADO@westsussex.gov.uk or 03302226450. For more information, please see the relevant webpage on allegations against someone who works with children.

#### What should parents/carers do when accessing activities or services?

Parents/carers should assure themselves that their children will be safe when they go off to a sports club, therapist, childminder etc. Not all sports clubs, youth groups, therapists are regulated, meaning that they may not be safe to work or volunteer with children. Not everyone who works or volunteers with children has a DBS check!

#### National Online Safety



Recently rising in popularity among children and young people, Wizz is a social networking app WIZZ That allows users to chat live with people from around the world. In similar fashion to a dating app, it facilitates conversations with people that users would not ordinarily meet – but of course, making connections to individuals online brings its own self-evident potential safety issues. While Wizz makes use of face recognition technology to assess users' age and group them by age group – but the software is far from perfect and there is no guarantee that some individuals won't attempt to exploit the app for sinister purposes. Our #WakeUpWednesday guide examines Wizz in detail, identifying pitfalls that parents and carers should be aware of.

In the guide attached you'll find tips on a number of potential risks such as catfishing, explicit content and "sextortion", and examines how trusted adults can take young people to avoid these

possible threats.
