English: 'Retelling the story of 'Escape from Pompeii' Writing a play script about the events in Pompeii. Writing a newspaper report about the events in Pompeii during Roman time. Key texts: Escape from Pompeii I was there - Boudicca The Roman Record	Stunning start: Dressing up as a Roman and taking part in Roman activities. Trip to Fishbourne Roman villa Fabulous Finish: Performing our playscripts	Science: In science we will be learning about animals, including humans. In particular, we will be learning the names of our bones, creating a menu and exploring why food is good for us.
	Visits and visitors: St Johns Church Fishbourne Roman villa	Art: Beatriz Milhaze inspired artwork. Designing, creating and evaluating stained glass windows in the style of Beatriz Milhaze.
History: The experience of the Romans arriving in Britain. What you needed to become a Roman soldier. What training took place when you became a soldier. What punishment took place in the army.	PE: The children will be learning different events in athletics. starting off with long distance running and then developing their sprinting technique. We will be covering javelin and push throws. Finally, your children will be learning both long jump and triple jump. This will be practice for their sports day in the final weeks of summer term.	Life skills: In life skills, your children will be exploring different kinds of Relationships. Between child and child friendships, different forms of families and the importance of having healthy relationships in our lives. They will also be learning about how their bodies will change as they grow up.
R.E: The life of Jesus. The children will be learning that Jesus was a person from history. They will also be looking at what kind of life Jesus had as a boy.	Music: Dot notation Pitch Learning a Roman march	Computing: Your children will develop their knowledge of sequencing commands for a result. We will be using scratch to change the motion, sound and events of different characters. They will be using their knowledge of program design to hopefully create a piano animation.

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Maths:

In maths, we will revisit the topic of fractions to learn how to add and subtract them. By the end of the topic, your children should be able to find a fraction of a given number or shape.

After fractions we will be moving onto money by converting between pounds and pence. We will also be exploring how to give change and explore real-life scenarios.

We will then be learning about time. Your children all have watches so we will be practicing how to read both analogue and digital clocks.

Suggestions for home learning:

Investigate where Roman roads are in Burgess Hill.

Make a Roman board game.

Draw different representations of dot notation.

Look and read different representations of age related news stories.
